

### **Remote Learning Pupil Voice**

The teachers asked the children during a live google meet session the following question and children had the opportunity to put their hands up and share their thoughts. Most children contributed at some point during the sessions. The number of children from each year group was approximately;

Reception- 18 (14 in school)    Year 1 -25 (18 in school)    Year 2 – 33 (12 in school)

<b>What do you like about remote learning?</b>
My parents teaching me (4) maths (8) Doing video calls with you Seeing my friends on the screen (3) My little brother is here Being with my family (more than 8) I can have breaks I can play games I can play with my toys Doing spellings with my Daddy Listening to my Dad's music Nothing (2) Getting breaks when I'm writing Reading Writing (8) DT activities (more than 2) Baking
<b>What do you find tricky about home learning?</b>
My Mum and Dad teaching me Writing (5) Catching up with everything (if miss live sessions because my grown ups are busy) Trying to concentrate Sitting at the kitchen table to do maths Not seeing my friends (2) My brother distracts me Almost everything Getting on Bug Club Getting it so my ipad can write on the worksheets Maths (4) I forget to look at the clock and miss the start of a live lesson The internet connection When Mummy and Daddy are working I have to do it myself When Mummy is working I have to rush my work (2) Reading on the screen (Bug club)
<b>What would you like more of?</b>
Coming back to school! Maths (8) Creativeness

<b>Is there anything you would like less of?</b>
Writing (9) Phonics Maths Video calls spellings
<b>Is there anything we could give you that would help?</b>
More teachers Sound mats More time to think about things Spellings (word mats) Maths equipment Writing toolkit Role play and Story making table! More books to read
<b>How many children use Bug Club</b>
Lots of children said they are accessing Bug Club (more than 50%) but quite a number (at least 7) said they are finding it tricky to get on to.
<b>Who is reading other books at home?</b>
Almost all children indicated that they were reading other books at home.
<b>Is there anyone who isn't reading anything at home</b>

**In response to the questionnaire we will;**

- Establish who is having bug club issues – get a definite list and check these logins and check them.
- Allow parents to come and swap reading books for those children that are finding reading books on screen tricky.
- Put word and sound mats and any relevant maths resources e.g. hundred square, in a folder called Resources in the google classrooms. Paper copies will also be prepared for collection upon request.
- Swap one the writing sessions each week for a class chat/games session.
- Ensure that at least one afternoon session is either DT, Art or something creative/practical
